PROGRAM INFORMATION 2009/2010

Our Waldorf Inspired Elementary Homeschool Program is for Grades One and Three. We are two parents who have committed to homeschooling our children and we invite other families, who would like to enrol their children in a homeschooling environment, to join our intimate learning group.

The program runs Monday through Thursday mornings, 9:00am to 12:30pm, from September to June, in the Cedar Bridge School building. We offer a comprehensive academic, artistic, and physical education program that is presented in a supportive, structured and non-competitive environment. We follow the curriculum as indicated by Rudolph Steiner and the Association of Waldorf Schools of North America.

Rudolph Steiner was a pioneer in the field of developmentally based, age-appropriate learning. He sought to develop a balanced education for the “whole child”, one which would engage the child’s thinking, feeling and willing (doing): an education for the head, heart and hands. From early childhood through high school, Waldorf educators teach according to the changing inner development of the child

The uniqueness of the Waldorf curriculum lies primarily in how and when the children are taught. Perception, feeling, concept: these are the three steps in a learning process that prepares the intellect for the abstract and conceptual thinking which will become possible later, in adolescence.

The morning main lesson, a two-hour period, starts each school day. Each core subject (math, ancient cultures, geography...) is taught for a three to five week block of time. The lesson can delve into each subject in-depth and has the opportunity to enhance these topics with poetry, painting, modeling and drama. Intellectual learning is always combined with artistic, rhythmical and practical work. The uninterrupted, two-hour main lesson is the academic cornerstone upon which the day is built. It encourages the child to become absorbed in, even saturated with, his subject when presented in this type of block structure.

The extra lessons make up the rest of the morning. These include subjects requiring regular repetition in shorter lessons (foreign languages, for example) and activities that are more social in nature; games and sports, painting, handwork and gardening.

Lessons are taught directly by the tutor, rather than via textbooks or computers. The subject matter comes alive through the teachings of the tutor. The children make their own books for each subject, recording and illustrating the substance of their lessons. These books, often artistic and beautiful, are an important way by which art is integrated into every subject.

Included in our weekly rhythm are nature walks through the forest and grounds, and visits to the nearby farm. Festivals, as well as children's birthdays, are celebrated throughout the year, creating treasured memories.

Parents are invited to build their knowledge about Waldorf education and child development through joining the Study Group at Cedar Bridge School. Families are welcome to participate in all events at Cedar Bridge School such as festivals and gatherings as involvement in these activities is an integral part of our work.

PROGRAMS & FEES

Administration Fee \$75.00
The administration fee is to be paid upon registration and is non-refundable.

Supply Fee \$200.00 approximately
Families are responsible for acquiring their own supplies. Supply list will be provided. Some extra supply costs may arise for additional projects upon negotiation.

Grade 1 \$350.00 monthly
Grade 3 \$350.00 monthly

We request an annual contractual commitment and an initial meeting of the tutor with the parent(s) and child is part of the registration process.

Tuition may be paid annually or monthly over a period of 10 months, post-dated cheques being the preferred method of payment. Monthly payments are due on the first day of each month. An interest charge of 2% per month may be applied to outstanding amounts after 30 days. Payment may be made by cheque or cash. It is expected that accounts will be paid on time. Overdue accounts put undue stress on the operation and finances of the program. In order to plan and maintain services over the entire 10-month period it is essential that the revenue from fees be assured. For this reason, students are enrolled for the entire program time or such portion as may remain after the date of entrance. The fact that the fee is paid in instalments does not constitute a fractional contract.

WITHDRAWAL

The financial contract commences on September 1. After the commencement of classes thirty days written notice is required to withdraw. In the event a child is withdrawn without the required thirty days notice the responsible party(ies) will be required to pay the outstanding fees to cover the thirty-day withdrawal notice period. This applies whether the student is withdrawn by parents or dismissed by the school. This requirement will be waived in the event the reason for withdrawal is of a confirmed medical nature.
